






# Q2. With sustainable development in mind, what do you think are the most important benefits the Neighbourhood Plan should bring to Saltash? 1412 respondents




# Q3. Do you go outside of Saltash for some services and facilities? 1334 respondents









Q5. where do you for for missing or inadeqate facilities?




# Q6. Do you consider that you belong to a distinct 'neighbourhood' in Saltash? 1328 respondents







Q8. What additional facilities would you say would make your neighbourhood a better place to live?




### Q9. What single change would most improve your quality of life as a resident of Saltash? 1100 respondents




Q10. Do you think that additional land for housing should be provided up to 2030 to meet specific housing needs such as affordable and social housing?












### Q15. How do you think the Neighbourhood Plan should deal with the Town Centre? 1337 respondents




# Q16. Do you think the 'Evening Economy' of Saltash should be more developed?



Q17. What would be most likely to attract you to Saltash in the evening? 1341 respondents




## Q18. How do you think the Neighbourhood Plan should deal with Saltash Waterfront? 1373 respondents




Q19. Are there any important public spaces or open areas in Saltash that you feel may be threatened in the future and should be protected?




### Q20. Open areas in Saltash that you feel may be threatened in the future and should be protected?




Q21. Are there any areas where you think action is needed to improve the environment (e.g. neglected land and buildings, poor street-scene?)






#### Q22. In which areas is action needed to improve the environment?











Q24. In which areas should more open and green space provided?

#### Which of these describes your household size best?


